**Project Green**, a biodiesel public education, training and production program, is an initiative of the Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind (AIDB).

The **Project Green** tour format includes:

- Class demonstration/Q&A four weeks prior to tour;
- Waste Vegetable Oil (WVO) collection jugs to students (students will collect WVO four weeks prior to visiting, disposing their collections during the tour);
- On-site video, demonstration, correlation to environmental science, mathematics and current events;
- Tour of E.H. Gentry Facility; and
- Tours to AIDB's other campuses (Alabama School for the Deaf, Alabama School for the Blind, Helen Keller School of Alabama and Alabama Industries for the Blind), if desired.

If schools cannot tour **Project Green** due to travel budget constraints, **Project Green** staff will travel to school systems to present the initiative, correlating **Project Green** to traditional classroom subjects and current events.
