Even though it is summer, students should also consider layers; it is hot outside and cold in the air conditioning. Clothing should be free of offensive language, drugs, or alcohol.

Label EVERYTHING - Classic iron-on/stick-on clothing labels, dishwasher-safe vinyl labels, and laundry pens can be used for this task.
