WHO ARE WE?

Short-Term Programs at Alabama Institute for Deaf and Blind (AIDB) offers three to seven day courses that focus on specific needs of Alabama's students who have visual impairments.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Students who have visual impairments and attend their local school during the academic year.

Students must be on, or close, to grade level with no behaviors that interfere with the learning of themselves or of others in the program.

Courses are available for students in 6th-12th grades.

Examples of Courses within Short-Term Programs

The Great AIDB Bake Off: 9^{th} - 12^{th} grades This course gives students specific instructions in cooking techniques and adaptations in order to learn to prepare meals in the kitchen.

Game of Life: 6th-12th grades

This weekend course gives both parents and students the opportunity to gain resources and learning opportunities together.

STP Formal Dance: 9th-12th grades
This course provides students with the opportunity to gain independent living skills, as well as social and self-determination skills.

Access to Curriculum: 6^{th} – 12^{th} grades This is a highly intensive course that focuses on compensatory skills needed by learners to access the general education curriculum.

Everything Braille/Nemeth Code:

6th-8th grades

These courses are designed for students who need intensive instruction in either Braille or Nemeth Code.
