Our Role Explained



The AIDB Outreach program started in 2014 to assist Alabama schools and parents/guardians with students who have hearing or vision loss. We currently have four staff members: two who specialize in blind/vision loss, and two who specialize in deaf/hard of hearing. They have decades of professional experience with Language needs, Orientation & Mobility, School Psychology, Intellectual Disabilities, School Psychometry...and of course, the day-to-day teaching of children with sensory loss.

Why should Alabama schools/families consider contacting us?

- New students with sensory loss, or whose loss is newly diagnosed
- Student with sensory loss who's encountered a new challenge
- Families and/or school staff unfamiliar with serving students with sensory needs
- Even if you have no major concerns, but want to confirm you're doing all that you can
- No worries about cost our services are free to those we serve
